

2026 Support Staff:

FULL TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

Support staff utilize the J-1 Summer Work and Travel Visa. The US Department of State requires that applicants be full-time university students to be eligible for this visa:

- Post-secondary school students enrolled in and actively pursuing a degree or other full-time course
 of study at an accredited <u>classroom based</u>, post-secondary educational institution outside the United
 States;
- Have successfully completed at least one semester or equivalent of post-secondary academic study

Below is a comprehensive list of IENA's criteria to be considered a full-time university student who is eligible to apply as a support staff, utilizing the J-1 Summer Work and Travel Visa.

- Applicants must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits and/or 4 classes per semester
- Applicants must be a full-time student for the full academic year prior to their program
 - This means you must be enrolled in full time education for the Fall 2025 Semester and Spring 2026 semester to participate in Summer 2026
 - This is to establish your continuous education, as per US Embassy requests
 - As of February 2026, if an applicant's profile has not yet been processed, they will be required to submit their Spring 2026 transcripts to IENA for review
- Internships, Social Services, and Professional Practices
 - If taken as part of a university degree, applicants must provide dated documentation to support their internship, social service, or professional practice and its relation to their degree program
 - An applicant may have a semester where they are only taking an internship, social service, or professional practice as long as they took a full course load of classroom based classes the prior semester
- Applicants are required to submit the required documentation to establish their full time student status:
 - The IENA Proof of Student Status Form: This can be stamped and signed by an applicant's university or recruiter
 - Transcripts: In Mexico, these are also frequently referred to as "Kardex"
 - Only accepted if the applicant's name is clearly listed, the document is dated, and a full list of classes and/or credits is listed
 - Copy of Active Student Account
 - A Student ID is acceptable if it is dated
 - A screen shot of a student portal/ website, as long as name and date are visible
 - A letter from the applicant's university, must be dated

For support staff applying specifically from Colombia:

- Applicants must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits and/or 4 classes per semester
 - If you are a support staff applying from Colombia, you must meet the 12 credit minimum
- Colombian support staff must have up-to-date transcripts (Spring 2026) when they attend their US Embassy interview
 - US Embassy in Bogota has specifically requested that support staff applicants attend their interview with the most up-to-date versions of their university documents
